What is Windows 10 End of Life?

Windows 10 End of Life (EoL) means that Microsoft will stop providing security updates, patches and support for Windows 10 after **October 14, 2025**.

Why does this matter to my business?

Unsupported systems are prime targets for hackers, exposing your organization to security risks, compliance issues and operational disruptions.

What are the risks of not upgrading?

A delayed migration increases the risk of cyberattacks, data breaches and operational disruptions due to unsupported software.

Will this affect our compliance status?

Many regulations require supported software. Running EoL systems may lead to penalties for non-compliance.

What are the costs involved in upgrading?

Costs vary by organization but may include new hardware, software licenses and IT services. Planning early helps control costs.

How long does a typical migration take?

Timelines vary, but planning, testing and deployment can take several months depending on organization size.
